Services Pupil Premium

We are sure you are aware that we receive extra funding for our forces children so we thought it would be good to share some of the ways we support children who have parents in the Armed Forces.

We now have a forces children coordinator for each key stage that leads interventions with the relevant children to support their learning. On Wednesday lunchtimes we have a HMS Heroes Club for KS1 and on Friday for KS2. Our two coordinators, Mrs Monks and Mrs Timpson, look to support our children in all sorts of ways depending on their circumstances. When they identify a need or parents contact the school they look to provide support with emotional and social issues at key times in children's lives e.g. when a parent has been deployed. It is great that a child has someone to talk to at these difficult times. Sometimes this is done in small groups when parents are away on the same ship as it is lovely for the children to share thoughts and experiences, but if a child needs a one to one chat this is also catered for.

The fund cannot be used to pay for school trips or extra curricular activities but it can be legitimately used for activities that will help support learning in a wide variety of ways. If you have any further ideas that may help our forces children then please let us know. We hold coffee mornings so that you can talk through any ideas on a less formal basis and we are always happy to hear your thoughts on further development.

Pupil Voice



This week we asked Rosie and Harvey from Year 3 to tell us their thoughts on what activities help them learn. What is mastery? What is a virtue?



Rosie: 'I learn best in literacy, especially writing and spellings and independent writing. It depends on how easy it is! I don't learn if it's too easy as I already know it. I like to be challenged and independent writing can be challenging as I have to think it through and plan it. The Rs that help me learn best are Resilient Roger because I don't want to give up - I keep trying because I want to get it right so I know it. Reflective Rosetta helps me with spelling. I didn't know how to spell FRIEND and it was corrected in my book so I reflected on it and now I get the spelling right.'

I think Mastery means when you have a subject you practice it, then you know it really well. I looked it up in Helston library in a dictionary too'.

Harvey: 'I learn best from making lots of mistakes, not everyone is perfect. In maths I learn from making mistakes and that's the fun bit - making the mistakes and learning to do better. Ready Ralph helps me think about always being ready for learning and it's fun at this school. Reflective Rosetta also helps me reflect on my mistakes. Even when I am not in school, manners are important. I am a good listener and I like to listen lots to be a Responsible Rashida for Mrs Bassett. She asks me to be responsible in class.'

I think mastery is when you are bad at something then you come back to it another day and get better at it. You get good at mastering it.

Rosie decided that one of her virtues is being helpful. She explained that she loves helping adults and younger children. Harvey decided he is enthusiastic and helpful. He is always ready to go to school and wanting to help others.
