Childline

Childline has launched an online self-help tool for young people experiencing bullying. 'Bounce back from bullying' aims to help young people understand whether what they are experiencing is bullying; build their resilience and gain help and support from counsellors. The tool asks questions about different aspects of bullying. Facebook Portal

We would like to draw your attention to a new initiative launched by Facebook called the 'Parents Portal' which aims to help parents, guardians and teachers to be better informed about child safety online.

Children spend on average 3.4 hours a day on their smartphones and nowadays 62% of 11 year-olds have a Facebook profile. The Parents Portal, which has been created by Facebook, their safety partners and parents around the world tries to answer some of the many questions surrounding the internet. This online platform provides an important resource with a Bullying Prevention Hub, important Parenting Tips, advice and important links to safety experts. This week we asked Lucy and Luke from Year 2 to tell us their thoughts on what activities help them learn. What is mastery? What is a virtue?



Lucy likes maths and she learns best when she is being independent. Maths is the best thing so far this year. When she gets stuck she tries to think for herself. The Rs help her to do this as Responsible Rashida has taught her that she is in control of things like her behaviour.
