


Super Spanish

A group of children from Year 5 that went to London have been talking about their experiences. Joe, Olivia, Michael and Adam thought that London was amazing!

They also thought the 4D shows were cool. Joe said that 'Matilda was amazing, it was very funny how Mrs Trunchbull was a man, though it also annoyed me as a woman could have played the part, but the special effects were so fantastic. The theatre experience was incredible with amazing acting and we loved the music!'. They thought that Madame Tussauds was great too as you get to see all of your heroes and have your photos taken with them. Adam thought the London guided tour was really cool because you got to see all the monuments at first hand and the guide explained all the statues. We saw all the places where Harry Potter was filmed!' Michael was astounded that there were so many different palaces in London. Olivia said watching MPs in The Houses of Parliament was amazing because you actually got to see people debating and it was being recorded live on TV. At the Natural History Museum, they saw a moving T Rex which Adam thought looked so realistic because it was made out of papier-mâché and had some great sound effects.
